# MURPHY BI-WEEKLY WRITING TIP

## **Understanding Instruction Key Words**

Dear Murphy Students:

Welcome to the Spring semester! Where do we start?

Usually with the assignment prompt or instructions. However, it can be unclear what exactly the professor is asking us to do. This week's tip will help define a few common words professors use in their instructions to help clarify what to do.

## **Common Key Words**

## **Describe**:

Give <u>details</u> about something (Who, What, When, Where, Why, How; *or* the 5 senses)

Example:

Describe how small group instruction can be implemented in the classroom.

### Answer:

Who implements it? What are the steps to implement it? When is it implemented? Where? Why?

## Analyze:

<u>Divide</u> something into <u>parts</u> + <u>show</u> how the parts <u>connect</u> to what's being asked

## Example:

Analyze the impact of student-centered learning on students.

#### Answer: What are:

What are the different parts/components of student-centered learning? How do these parts/components affect students?

## **Explain:**

- Give <u>reasons</u> why or how + <u>evidence</u> to support
- Make something <u>clear</u>

## **Example:**

Explain the advantages and disadvantages of student-centered teaching

## Answer:

What are the advantages? Why? Any examples or evidence? What are the disadvantages? Why? Any examples or evidence?

## **Evaluate:**

<u>Judge</u> the overall <u>strengths</u> and <u>weaknesses</u> of something + give evidence/examples

## **Example:**

**Evaluate** small group instruction as a teaching strategy.

## Answer:

What are the strengths of small group instruction? What are the weaknesses? Is it overall a good strategy? Why?
